# ^	Caracara lutosa Guadalupe Caracara	Deletion from Appendix II	The Guadalupe Caracara Caracara lutosa was endemic to Guadalupe Island, Mexico, where it is thought to have been extirpated in 1903 as a result of poisoning and hunting. It is considered extinct by IUCN and under Mexican legislation. There has been no recorded trade in this species since its listing in CITES in 1975. In the unlikely event of its rediscovery, there is no reason to assume that it would be affected by international commercial trade, which would anyway be prohibited under Mexican law. ACCEPT
