At CoP10, the CBD adopted the Global Strategy for Plant Conservation (GSPC) 2011–2020, including outcome-oriented targets for 2020. This side event will focus on the GSPC's objective that plant diversity should be "used in a sustainable and equitable manner" (Objective 3), including its targets that:

- *no species of wild flora will be endangered by international trade;*
- *all wild-harvested plant-based products will be sourced sustainably; and*
- *indigenous and local knowledge innovations and practices associated with plant resources will be maintained or increased.*

The event will discuss progress in achieving Objective 3 and seek practical suggestions to focus the efforts of NGOs, development and conservation organizations, governments, communities and the private sector towards delivering on the GSPC targets for 2020, which in turn contribute to meeting Aichi Targets 4, 6 and 18 and the Nagoya Protocol. We invite development and conservation organizations, IPLCs, private sector and government representatives to join us.
